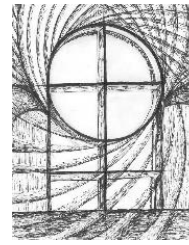
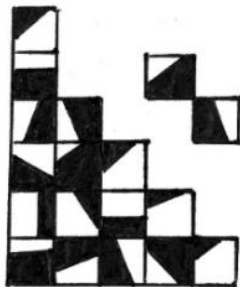
Vision Statement

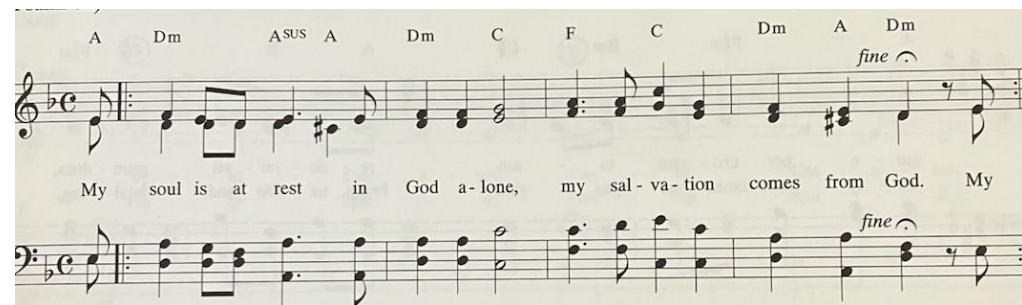

Belmont Carpool to/from Greencroft: If you are available to be a carpool driver on Sunday mornings beginning in July, please let Uryna or Mandy know. We still need one regular (monthly) driver.

MCC has another School Kit Challenge for August 2025--asking for help in collecting 25,000 school kits. Last year, MCC shipped 52,481 school kits to communities in Burundi, Chad, Malawi, South Sudan, Ukraine, the U.S. and Zambia. Belmont plans to participate in this challenge with the whole congregation packing school kits in August. More details regarding the necessary school supplies for the kits will be coming soon. At this time, money is needed to purchase fabric for sewing the bags and purchasing the metal pencil sharpeners needed for each school kit. If you wish to make a monetary donation, please include it with the offering, specifying "MCC School Kits" in the memo line of your check or offering envelope. Please submit these donations by Sunday, July 20.
