

Vision Statement

- ³“Happy are people who are hopeless, because the kingdom of heaven is theirs.
⁴“Happy are people who grieve, because they will be made glad.
⁵“Happy are people who are humble, because they will inherit the earth.
⁶“Happy are people who are hungry and thirsty for righteousness, because they will be fed until they are full.
⁷“Happy are people who show mercy, because they will receive mercy.
⁸“Happy are people who have pure hearts, because they will see God.
⁹“Happy are people who make peace, because they will be called God’s children.
¹⁰“Happy are people whose lives are harassed because they are righteous, because the kingdom of heaven is theirs.
¹¹“Happy are you when people insult you and harass you and speak all kinds of bad and false things about you, all because of me. ¹²Be full of joy and be glad, because you have a great reward in heaven. In the same way, people harassed the prophets who came before you.

You come to rule the world with justice and truth.
We pray for the world, for all who are ensnared in greed, violence, and oppression.

You bless those who hunger and thirst for righteousness;
they will be filled.

We offer you other concerns we carry in our hearts.
(open prayers)
You bless the peacemakers;
they will be called your children.

God whose justice shines like the sun,
you bless all who seek first your kingdom and righteousness.
Fill our hearts with the spirit of the Beatitudes,
that we may live this day in simplicity, mercy, and joy.
Through Jesus, who taught us to do so,
