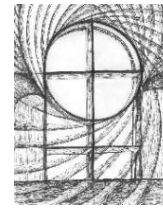

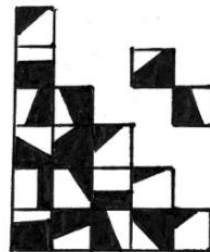
### Vision Statement
